Risk and Resilience in Child Development

How do children survive and, in some cases, thrive in the wake of adversity? From acute traumatic events, such as natural disasters, to the everyday challenges of wars waged in and outside the family setting, some children are thriving despite marked threats to their well being, while others are suffering because of them. Nearly 50 years of research has sought to identify the processes underlying the "better-than-expected" developmental outcomes that typify resilience. Although some cite a "short list" of features and factors that contribute to resilience, On March 2nd, UCR Professor Tuppett Yates will explore findings from studies following 250 high risk preschoolers across the transition into adolescence and 200 emancipated foster youth across the transition into adulthood, and will depict a nuanced picture of resilience in the developmental process.

Tuppett M. Yates is a developmental and clinical psychologist. Dr. Yates has extensive clinical experience with high-risk youth, particularly those involved with child protective services. She earned her Ph.D. in developmental psychopathology and clinical science from the University of Minnesota, and completed her clinical training at Harvard Medical School. Dr. Yates joined the UCR faculty in 2006. In 2008, she founded the UCR Guardian Scholars Program to provide a comprehensive network of support to emancipated foster youth as they pursue their higher education at UCR. Her work has been supported by the National Science Foundation and the National Institute of Health, and private foundations such as the Haynes Foundation and the William T. Grant Foundation.
