Why Are We In Love With Baby Yoda?

Since making its debut just a couple months ago in the Star Wars spinoff, The Manadalorian, the world just can't get enough of the Baby Yoda. Could anyone have predicted that this character would set not only the science fiction world, but every toy manufacturer and retailer into a frenzy? UCR Professor Katherine Stavropoulos could.

Stavropoulos studies "cute aggression," the overwhelming urge to squeeze, pinch, smother, or bite very cute things - without doing any harm. This can manifest itself when coming in to contact with a kitten, puppy, infant child, or Baby Yoda! While this reaction may seem irresistible, Stavropoulos has been studying through neuroscience why we emotionally melt over things with certain physical features, how they trigger a care-taking response, and why our brains make us simultaneously want to smother them.

Katherine Stavropoulos is an Assistant Professor of Special Education and Assistant Director of

the SEARCH Center at UCR. A licensed clinical psychologist, she completed her Postdoctoral work at Yale and received her Ph.D in Experimental Psychology from UC San Diego. Dr. Stavropoulos conducts translational studies to explore the reward system in ASD (Autism Spectrum Disorder), as well as how anxiety contributes to social deficits in ASD. Since the Baby Yoda phenomenon emerged, she has been featured in Psychology Today, Yahoo, Mother Jones, and even an article in the food magazine Delish titled, "Why Do We Want to Eat Baby Yoda?"
